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Who can apply for a Mortar Board Fellowship?

- Current or former collegiate members of Mortar Board who have not previously received a Mortar Board fellowship are eligible to apply.
- A member of any age may apply for a Mortar Board Fellowship for a postbaccalaureate degree in any field.

What constitutes an application?

A completed application for a Mortar Board fellowship, due on or before March 1, consists of three parts:

1. An online [application](#)
2. A current, official transcript from every institution of higher education attended (emailed to fellowships@mortarboard.org or mailed to the National Office)
3. Two [recommendations](#)

How many applicants are there typically each year and how is the number of awards determined?

There are typically between 50 and 100 applicants each year, and from that pool, between eight and twelve fellowships are awarded. The Fellowship Selection committee decides how many fellowships to award and in what amounts.

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What time frame do Mortar Board Fellowships cover?

All awards are for one academic year only and must be used beginning in the academic year starting after the award of the fellowship. Fellowships may not be used for graduate degree study already completed at the time of award or that begin later than six months after the fellowship is awarded.

What is the amount awarded?

The amount of money awarded depends on the current resources of the Mortar Board National Foundation. In 2015, eight fellowships ranging from \$3,500 to \$5,000 each were awarded.

To whom are the fellowship monies paid?

The monetary award is sent directly to the Mortar Board Fellow, in two equal installments spread over the academic year.

Am I eligible to apply for the Mortar Board Fellowship if I have already begun my graduate degree program?

Yes, provided you have not previously received a Mortar Board Fellowship, will be continuing graduate studies in the next academic year and otherwise meet all eligibility criteria.

I plan to pursue postbaccalaureate studies outside of the United States. Am I eligible to apply for a Mortar Board Fellowship?

Yes. You may use a Mortar Board Fellowship for graduate studies at any accredited institution of higher learning.

I am not a citizen of the United States but was initiated into Mortar Board at my university or college. Am I eligible to apply for a Mortar Board Fellowship?

Yes. All current or former collegiate members of Mortar Board who have not previously received a Mortar Board Fellowship, will be continuing graduate studies in the next academic year and otherwise meet all eligibility criteria are eligible to apply.

I haven't decided yet what school I am going to attend. Could I still apply without having made a final decision on what school to attend?

Yes. You need not have decided which school you will be attending for graduate work. The Mortar Board Fellowship application includes a section to list all institutions to which you have applied.

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I will be taking one or more gap years before continuing postbaccalaureate studies.

Is there a time limit as to how far into the future I can start graduate school?

Yes. All awards are for one academic year only and must be used beginning in the academic year starting after the Fellowships are awarded. Fellowships may not be used for graduate studies already completed at the time of award or for graduate studies that begin later than six months after the Fellowship is awarded. Fellowships cannot be deferred and used at a later time.

I previously applied for a Mortar Board Fellowship. May I apply again?

If you previously applied, but did not receive a Mortar Board Fellowship and you are still otherwise eligible, you may apply again. You will need to complete a new application form and submit two current recommendations. If your transcripts from the previous application are not changed, you may email fellowships@mortarboard.org prior to March 1 and ask that those same transcripts be used. If those transcripts have changed due to additional studies or institutions, please submit your current transcripts.

Should I submit transcripts from all higher learning institutions I have attended?

Yes. Applicants are required to submit transcripts of all academic results related to undergraduate studies and any graduate studies completed or in process at the time of application. Applicants may submit additional transcripts of other studies in support of their application after the submission deadline.

Are applicants expected to pay for an official transcript to be delivered, or will an unofficial transcript suffice?

Applicants are required to provide a current, official transcript as part of the application process. In many cases these can be delivered electronically at very little cost. All finalists must have an official transcript on file. Official transcripts may be directed electronically to fellowships@mortarboard.org or mailed to

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Am I able to email my transcript myself and then send it to Mortar Board?

Applicants are required to provide current, official transcript as part of the application process. Nowadays many institutions will provide a secure portal to access your official transcript to organizations that you designate. If your institution does not offer this service, please request that a hardcopy, current, official transcript be sent to

If you are concerned about whether a hardcopy official transcript will reach the Mortar Board National Office before the application deadline, you may email a student-accessed transcript or scanned copy of the official transcript.

Should graduate school entrance exam scores, such as GRE, MCAT, GMAT, or LSAT be sent to the fellowship committee as additional evidence of academic achievement?

No. The Fellowship Selection Committee does not consider entrance exam scores and you need not forward these.

Who should recommendations be from?

Two letters of recommendation must be from faculty or other persons who can speak with authority about your ability to do graduate work in your chosen field and about your personal qualities and achievement. It will be helpful if one of your recommenders could write about your out-of-classroom experiences related to your degree objective and to your leadership and service on campus and in the community.

You will supply their names and information in the application form.

Can I supply more than two recommendations?

Only the first two recommendations received will be considered by the Mortar Board Fellowship Selection Committee. If you are uncertain if a person will be able to submit a recommendation by the March 1 deadline, you could certainly ask more than two recommenders to provide recommendations. Recommendations will be accepted in the order they are received.

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One of the persons I asked to submit a letter of recommendation prefers to send a hardcopy letter rather than complete the online recommendation form. Is this acceptable and if so, where should the letter be sent?

While completion of the online recommendation form is preferred, we understand that some recommenders prefer to send hardcopy letters. Hardcopy letters should address the same information required in the online recommendation form, namely:

- Name and college/university of fellowship applicant.
- Name, title, institution or organization, email, and phone number of the person submitting the recommendation.
- How long has the person known the applicant.
- A description of the person's connection with the applicant.
- Rating the applicant on
 - Leadership in collegiate organizations,
 - Leadership in community organizations,
 - Mastery of and excitement for academic work, and
 - Promise for achievement in future academic endeavors.
- Any additional comments in support of the applicant.
- Signature of person making the recommendation.

Recommendations received through the applicant will not be accepted. All recommendations must be received by Mortar Board on or before March 1.

I have letters of recommendation that were written in support of my graduate school applications. May I submit those letters as my recommendations for as part of my Mortar Board Fellowship application?

Letters of recommendation prepared for another application may be submitted if:

- the recommendation letter is submitted directly by the recommender or their staff;
- the recommendation letter addresses the same information required in the online form for Mortar Board Fellowship recommendations; and
- the recommendation letter was written within the preceding nine months.

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Does each recommender also have to write a formal letter of recommendation and send it in separately from the recommendation form?

No. Completion of the online recommendation form by two different recommenders is sufficient.

Will Mortar Board follow up with those whose recommendations are not in?

No. Each applicant is responsible for following up to assure recommendations and transcripts are submitted.

I inadvertently submitted an application or recommendation that contained an error. May I correct the error?

Yes, if before March 1. If you note an error in an application or recommendation, you may correct the error by completing and submitting a new form, then notifying fellowships@mortarboard.org that the earlier form should be discarded and replaced with the latest, correct form. Forms cannot be corrected after March 1.

I applied to several graduate institutions but the application space only has space for five. How can I submit information about additional institutions?

If you would like all institutions to which you applied listed in your application packet, please email a list of graduate institutions beyond the first five to fellowships@mortarboard.org before March 1 to have those included in your application. No additional institutions can be listed in your application after March 1.

Are members who applied for a Mortar Board Fellowship able to update their college acceptance portion of the application?

Prior to March 1, applicants may advise if they are accepted to graduate programs for which they were unsure or waitlisted. Email fellowships@mortarboard.org with these updates prior to March 1. On March 1 and after, changes to the graduate school acceptance status in the application cannot be made; however Mortar Board will retain the information in your file and advise the final review committee as appropriate.

There is not enough room to list all of my publications in the awards section of the application. May I submit an additional list?

If you would like all of your publications or other awards listed in your application packet, please email the list of additional information to fellowships@mortarboard.org prior to March 1 to have those included in your application. No additional publications or awards can be listed in your application after March 1.

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How can I check to assure all of my application materials have been submitted?

You are solely responsible for the completion of the three parts of the application. That is, the National Office staff will not initiate calls or emails to advise you about parts that are missing or incomplete. Applicants will receive an email confirmation that the online application was received. You are invited to email fellowships@mortarboard.org or call the Mortar Board National Office (614) 488-4094 to determine the status of your application.

Who reviews Fellowship applications?

The Mortar Board Fellowship Selection Committee draws from the Mortar Board National Foundation Trustees and other experienced Mortar Board alumni to serve as application readers. Candidates will be judged on their academic record, recommendations, goals and objectives, and contribution/commitment to Mortar Board.

What information or materials are finalists required to submit?

Finalists are required to enter into an acceptance agreement that includes but is not limited to:

- providing the Mortar Board National Office with a copy of a letter of acceptance from the institution where you will matriculate in the fall;
- express thanks in written form to the Mortar Board donor whose generosity made the fellowship possible;
- participate in a conference call with other Mortar Board Fellows;
- provide Mortar Board with a short, but detailed progress report reflecting on experiences and learning during the first term of study; and
- provide a copy of your official grade report.

Finalists will also be required to submit a photo, preferably a headshot and at least 300 DPI for use in Mortar Board media releases and publications. Fellows are encouraged to attend the Candlelight Banquet and all programs at the Mortar Board National Conference.

I have excellent credentials, leadership experience and a strong track record of service; why was I not selected to receive a Mortar Board Fellowship?

As with other competitive honor society scholarships and fellowships, Mortar Board considers, in combination, applicants' grades, courses, research, unique experiences, campus leadership, community service and reference letters. As Mortar Board members, all applicants enter the process as strong candidates. The number of applicants and mix of qualifications varies each year, and all applications are given full and careful consideration during our multi-level reviews. The Mortar Board National Foundation resources compel us to offer a limited number of Fellowships.
